Marking 30 Years of the Yahalom Unit - and 10 Years of the Foundation

On August 5, 2025, a festive assembly was held to mark 30 years since the establishment of the Yahalom Unit and 10 years since the founding of Yahalom Foundation. Around 3,500 soldiers and commanders, active duty and reserves, veterans from all generations, public figures, and family members gathered at Ra'anana Amphipark for a moving, unifying, and pride-filled evening.

The assembly hosted by journalist Danny Kushmaro, was an impressive and powerful event that became a great celebration of heritage, intergenerational connection, and recognition of bereaved families and the unit's wounded.

During the evening, company areas were opened, allowing old friends and new ones to reconnect. Later, the central ceremony took place, weaving together stories from the past and current achievements, alongside impressive displays of the unit's capabilities. The atmosphere was a rare combination of pride, strength, memory, and joy.

The highlight of the evening was the launch of the unit's Heritage Book - an exceptional project that had been prepared over the course of a year and a half. The book was written after thousands of hours of research by author Shmuel Katz, accompanied by powerful photography from Ziv Koren, and based on an extensive collection of materials, testimonies, and stories from meetings with veterans and founders. It recounts the history of the unit from the Hebrew Resistance Movement in 1945, through the War of Independence, the establishment of the Special Demolitions Unit in 1965, the founding of Yael in 1982, the creation of Yahalom in 1995 in Sirkin, and up to the Swords of Iron war. The book serves as a central cornerstone in preserving Yahalom's operational and human legacy, passing its unique story to future generations.








The Yahalom Foundation in Toronto - A Moving Encounter with the Community
